THE COVER FLOWER

Harvey Short has added another japonica variety to his list of seedling introductions that started in 1950. 'Gay Chieftain' is a large semi-peony to full peony high built flower that reaches $5\frac{1}{2}$ inches in diameter. Petals are off-white to flesh pink with heavy striping of oxblood red, and a center sunburst of strong gold stamens gives the flower startling and vivid coloring. It is a good keeper and definitely is a show flower. Many sports are likely to occur, from light pink to clear deep red.
