#### C. RETICULATA—'MISS TULARE'

'Miss Tulare' is a chance seedling of 'Crimson Robe.' The flower is a bright red to rose red, large to very large, rose form double to full peony form. The plant has a vigorous, upright growth and it blooms in mid-season. The seedling first bloomed in 1968 and it has since been propagated by Nuccio's Nurseries.
