'Ed Combatalade' is a C. japonica seedling which was developed by Kramer Bros. Nursery of Upland, California. The cultivar is named for, perhaps, the most well known camellia hobbiest in Northern California, Mr. Ed Combatalade. In fact, Combatalade is better known by the name of "Mr. Camellia" since he is credited with having promoted the Sacramento Camellia Society's Annual Show into a week-long community Camellia Festival with ovr 300,000 visitors!

The cultivar is a red, formal, double; medium in size with good foliage and a vigorous up-right growth. It was introduced in 1977.
