THE COVER FLOWER

'SILVER CLOUD' is a chance C. Japonica seedling discovered in the seed-ling patch at Nuccio's Nursery in 1976. It was given the seedling number of 7626 and placed under observation. When it bloomed again the second year Bill Woodroof saw the flower and he literally "flipped out!" In fact, every one who has seen the flower has become completely captivated. The cultivar was tested for grafting and cutting tendencies, propagated, and released this Fall. The bloom is a very large, white, loose peony form with bright yellow stamens. The plant has a vigorous, upright growth. The cultivar blooms from November through May in the Southern California area.
