THE COVER FLOWER

The Cover flower is a cross of 'Flower Girl' \times 'Crimson Robe' and it has been given the tentative name of 'USC-Fight On.' The colors are the dark red and gold colors of the University of Southern California football team and the song "Fight On" is known throughout the football world. The seedling was developed by Lee Gaeta and Meyer Piet and it first bloomed in the spring of 1979. The flower is a 4 to 4 $\frac{1}{2}$ inch semi-double with dark red, wavy petals. The center of the bloom has red stamens and a 2-inch burst of bright golden anthers. Negotiations are underway with a local nursery to propagate this new camellia for distribution to the public.
