Species Japonica

C. M. GORDY — Bright Pink with Gold anthers and Cream filaments. Large, semidouble with creped and ruffled petals. Vigorous, dense growth. E-M. (U.S. 2013 – Gordy).

DARLEEN GRACE — Cream White with a touch of Pink on the outer petals with Gold anthers and Cream filaments. Medium, semidouble to loose peony. Average, upright growth. M-L. (U.S. 2013 – Gordy).

ENCHANTED EVENING — Deep Lavender with Gold anthers and Pink filaments. Medium, anemone. Average, open growth. M. (Japonica ‘Edna Campbell’ seedling). (U.S. 2013 – Gordy).

GORDY’S PRETTY LADY – Clear Pink. Large to very large, semidouble to loose peony form with soft Yellow stamens. Average, open and upright growth. E-L. (Previously invalidly named Japonica ‘Pretty Lady’). (U.S. 2005 – Gordy).

HAPPY TALK — Soft Coral Red with Gold anthers and Cream filaments. Medium, loose peony to rose form double. Average, upright growth. (Japonica ‘Happy Times’ seedling). (U.S. 2013 – Gordy).

NIGHTFALL – Dark Red with very dark veins with bright Gold anthers and Pink filaments. Medium, single. Vigorous, upright growth. E. (Japonica ‘Royal Velvet’ seedling). E. (U.S. 2013 – Gordy).

ROSEMARIE OSTBERG – Very dark Pink with Gold anthers. Medium, semidouble to anemone. Average, upright growth. M. (U.S. 2013 – Gordy).

SCARLET RIBBONS – Vibrant Red with Gold anthers and Cream filaments. Medium, loose peony to rose form double. Average, spreading, open growth. E-L. (Japonica ‘Jean Clere’ seedling). (U.S. 2013 – Gordy).

SUE KENDALL – **Medium Pink**. Miniature, formal double. Vigorous, open, upright growth. E-L. (U.S. 1998 – D. Kendall, Modesto, CA).

WISHING STAR — Light Pink. Medium to large, semidouble to anemone form with star-shaped outer petals. Vigorous, compact, upright growth. M. (U.S. 1958 – McCaskill).

WITCH DOCTOR — Rose Red. Large, semidouble to rose form double. Average, compact growth. E-M. (U.S. 1960 – G. Demetropolis, Mobile, AL).

WITMAN YELLOW — White tinged Yellow. Medium, semidouble. Average, upright growth. M. (U.S. 1963 – Witman).

WOBBY BOY — White, flecked and blotched light Pink, shading to darker Pink. Medium, semidouble. Average, compact, upright growth. M-L. (U.S. 1983 — W Herbert, Ruston, LA).

WONDER CHILD — See ‘Betty Sheffield Blush’.

WONDERLAND – Brilliant, deep Rose. Large, semidouble to peony form. Vigorous, open growth. M-L. (U.S. 1960 — Short).

WONDER OF WHITE – White. Medium formal double. Vigorous, upright growth. E-M. (U.S. 2002– Gordon E. Fade, Pensacola, FL).

WOOD SPRITE — Blush Pink. Small, semidouble. Vigorous, bushy, upright growth. M. (U.S. 1959 – McCaskill).

Species Reticulata and Hybrids With Reticulata Parentage

NEDRA ANN MATHIS — Light Pink with Golden anthers and White filaments. Very large, semidouble to peony form. Vigorous, upright, spreading growth. M-L. (Reticulata Hybrid ‘Suzanne Withers’ x Reticulata Hybrid ‘Jean Pursel’). (U.S. 1996 — Hulyn Smith).

WALTER HOMEYER — Red with heavy frosting with Gold anthers and Gold filaments. Very large, semidouble to peony form. Average, upright, open growth. M-L. (U.S. 2004 — Hulyn Smith).

Hybrids With Other Than Reticulata Parentage

RANDOLPH MAPHIS — Incorrectly classified as a Reticulata and Non-retic Hybrid in the 2009 and 2014 Camellia Nomenclatures. It is a Reticulata only.

Species Sasanqua

LAURA CLAIRE – Incorrectly classified as a Sasanqua and Japonica in the 2006, 2009 and 2014 Camellia Nomenclatures. It is a Japonica only.

CAPTAIN MARTIN’S FAVORITE — Deep Pink splotched White. Medium, formal double to rose form double. Slow, compact, upright growth. M. (Europe to U.S. 1860’s — Magnolia).
