SHOW REGULATIONS AND SCHEDULE

ENTRIES:

- No entry fees. Any camellia hobbyist may make entries and are encouraged to do so. Novices may enter any class in addition to Class 22, which is for novices only. Commercial growers may enter Class 21, New Seedlings. Three entries of the same variety may be entered in the Singles Class, but an unlimited number of different varieties may be entered in the same class. **Do not use ink on entry cards! It runs when wet.**

CLASSIFICATION

-Blooms shall be placed in the proper class according to the latest edition of the Southern California *Camellia Nomenclature*. The Show Committee will gladly assist exhibitors in preparing entry cards and/or classifying entries.

PLACEMENT

Placement of blooms: 8:00 a.m. to 10:00 a.m., Saturday, February 1st.

- Exhibitors will place his/her entries on the display tables under the supervision of the Placement Committee. Blooms should be arranged in alphabetical order in all classes.
- Different forms of the same variety will be handled as separate varieties. Please label and display them in separate groups (Glen 40, Julia France, Mathotiana, R. L. Wheeler, etc.)
- Treated and non-treated blooms must be placed in their proper classes. Blooms in question will be reviewed by a special committee appointed by the Chairperson.
- Treated blooms should be entered in Classes 8, 9 and 10 – Special Culture.
- After entries are placed, please stay clear of the show tables.
- The Placement committee reserves the right to remove blooms of inferior quality.

JUDGING

Judging will begin at 10:30 a.m.

- Blooms will be judged in accordance with the rules of the Southern California Camellia Council, which gives equal weight to four qualities of characteristics: Color, form, size and condition.
- Blooming plants will be judged based on quality of blooms, shape of plant, quality of foliage and overall impression.
- Fragrant blooms, Class 11, will be judged giving 70% to fragrance and 30% to the other four qualities.
- The judges shall consider three awards in most cases. Should entries not warrant an award, none will be given.

-THE DECISION OF THE JUDGES IS FINAL-

TROPHIES

Trophies will be awarded for Best, Runner-up and Court of Honor at the discretion of the judges. Camellia Society members who win trophies at this show may choose Trophy Points or crystal. Best = 5points, Runner-up = 3 points, Court of Honor = 1 points. At the conclusion of camellia shows, points will be converted into gift certificates redeemable at Nuccio's Nurseries.

-Trophies and plants may be picked up at the close of the show, Sunday afternoon after 4:30 p.m.

ALL EXHIBITED BLOOMS WILL BE DISPOSED OF BY THE SHOW COMMITTEE

SHOW HOURS

UNLESS OTHERWISE NOTED, THERE WILL BE NO MORE THAN THREE ENTRIES OF THE SAME VARIETY IN THE SINGLE CLASS.

SINGLE BLOOMS, Non-Treated

- Class 1 – Japonica, Large or Very Large
- Class 2 – Japonica, Medium
- Class 3 – Japonica, Small
- Class 4 – Japonica, Miniature
- Class 5 – Non-Retic Hybrids
- Class 6 – Reticulata or Reticulata Hybrids
- Class 7 – Species, other than Japonicas, Reticulatas or Non-Retics

SINGLE BLOOMS, SPECIAL CULTURE (Treated)

- Class 8 – Japonica
- Class 9 – Reticulatas or Reticulata Hybrids
- Class 10 – Non-Reticulata Hybrids

CLASS 11 – FRAGRANT BLOOMS – Any variety with fragrance

- Class 11a – Very Large, Large, or Medium
- Class 11b – Small, Miniature

TRAY OF THREE BLOOMS, Same variety, Non-Treated

- Class 12 – Japonicas – Large or Very Large
- Class 13 – Japonicas – Medium
- Class 14 – Japonicas – Small
- Class 15 – Japonicas – Miniature
- Class 16 – Non-Retic Hybrids
- Class 17 – Reticulatas or Reticulata Hybrids

TRAY OF THREE BLOOMS, MIXED VARIETIES

- Class 18 – One Large, one Medium and one Small or Miniature (any species)

CLASS 19 – ONE AND TWO-YEAR OLD GRAFTED PLANTS

ONE TROPHY FOR THE BEST GRAFT WILL BE AWARDED. GRAFT MUST BE MADE BY THE EXHIBITOR. AN ENTRY CAN BE MADE FOR EACH YEAR.

CLASS 20 – CAMELLIA PLANT IN BLOOM. ANY SIZE CONTAINER. TWO (2) PLANTS PER EXHIBITOR.

CLASS 21 – NEW SEEDLINGS OR SPORTS

JAPONICAS, RETICULATAS OR HYBRIDS. PLANTS MUST NOT BE OFFERED FOR SALE. SPECIAL CULTURE BLOOMS MUST BE LABELED AS SUCH. NAME OF ORIGINATOR SHOULD BE GIVEN.

CLASS 22 – NOVICE OPEN TO EXHIBITORS WHO HAVE NEVER WON A BEST AWARD AT ANY PREVIOUS COUNCIL AFFILIATED SHOW (exclusive of mini-shows or non-regulation shows). **NO TREATED OR SPECIAL CULTURE BLOOMS.**

CLASS 23 – INTERMEDIATE – OPEN TO EXHIBITORS WHO HAVE WON LESS THAN THREE BEST TROPHIES IN ANY CAMELLIA SHOW. **NO TREATED OR SPECIAL CULTURE BLOOMS.**

CLASS 24 – “DR. ROY TESS MEMORIAL AWARD”. TO BE AWARDED FOR THE BEST FLOWER GROWN IN SAN DIEGO COUNTY OTHER THAN RETICULATA.

CLASS 25 - “CAPT. JAY J. VERMILYN MEMORIAL AWARD”. BEST RETICULATA GROWN IN SAN DIEGO.
