PLEASE READ BEFORE ORDERING

ALL OF OUR CAMELLIAS are container grown. In California our Camellias will be shipped either in their containers or will be balled and wrapped in waterproof material. Outside of California, in order to facilitate packing and eliminate excess weight, thereby cutting transportation costs, Camellias will either be balled or bare-rooted (unless requested otherwise). Notice to residents of the states of **Alabama, Arizona, Arkansas, Florida, Mississippi, South Carolina, Tennessee, Texas, Virginia and Foreign Countries**: All shipments of Camellias must be bare-rooted, and will be reballed in peat moss, and properly wrapped for shipping. We are experienced in shipping bare-rooted Camellias and have found the above method very successful. All states and countries requiring bare-root shipment of Camellias as listed above must be inspected and certified by the Los Angeles County Dept. of Agriculture. The fees charged for this service are as follows and must be added to your order.

WE HAVE SUCCESSFULLY shipped balled and bare-rooted Camellias all months of the year, but for best results we advise shipment from mid-October through March (we strongly advise against bare-root shipping after early March), during which time shipments will be made weekly. **From April through September shipments will only be made during the first and third weeks of each month.** Due to the holiday overload on shipping lines, we do not ship from Dec. 1 through Jan. 1

ALL AZALEAS offered in this catalog are grown in No. #1 containers (approx. 6" x 7") (some slow growing and dwarf varieties may be in pots approx. 3" x 4") and will be shipped in same or balled and wrapped. Azaleas can be shipped safely throughout the year. Shipments of Azaleas to states and foreign countries which require bare-rooting (or if requested) a charge of 50¢ per plant will be added. **Notice to residents of the above mentioned states and foreign countries:** An inspection certificate is required for all plants, including azaleas. Please use the above fee schedule. **Notice to the residents of Oregon and Washington:** These states do not allow the shipment of azaleas.

GUARANTEE

We give no guarantee that our plants will live and grow, but we do guarantee our stock to be well rooted, well grown, true to name and properly packed for shipments.

Claims for shortages and errors must be made immediately upon receipt of shipment and we will gladly rectify our mistake, but in no instance will our liability be more than the purchasing price.

Please note that our responsibility ceases upon delivery to forwarding companies and any claims for damages en route are to be made upon them by the purchaser. Risks and costs of transportation belong to purchaser.

CRATING CHARGES: In order to help cover crating costs, please add \$3.50 if your order is \$15.00 or less. If your order is over \$15.00 but not over \$50.00, please add \$7.50. If your order exceeds \$50.00, add \$7.50 plus 10% of the amount in excess of \$50.00. (For example, if your order amounts to \$74.00, your crating charge would be \$9.90, i.e., \$7.50 for the first \$50.00 plus \$2.40, which is 10% of the remaining \$24.00.)

CAMELLIA CULTURE

SOIL—Basically all camellias require the same culture. They prefer a well-drained soil that is high in humus content and just slightly acid. In preparing the soil for planting in the ground, mix equal portions of sandy loam and peat moss, by volume. If leaf mold is available, it may be used in place of peat moss.

PLANTING—Dig the planting hole twice as large as the root ball and one and one-half times as deep. Fill the bottom of the hole with the prepared soil and tamp down firmly so that the top of the root ball, when placed in the hole, is one inch ABOVE the soil surface, as there will be some settling. The only way camellias are temperamental is in the depth of the planting. The air requirement of the root is high, and when planted too deep, the roots will smother. The root crown should never be more than two inches below the surface of the soil. Fill in around the sides of the root ball with this same mixture, tamping it down firmly with the feet as you fill, then mound soil three inches high in the form of a saucer on the outside rim of the planting hole. Fill this saucer with water.

WATERING—Camellias should be moist at all times, but caution should be taken against their being WET at all times. Water well and deeply, but only as often as your own local weather conditions demand. Too much water too often will cut off the air the roots must have. During the flowering period, watering should be watched as the mature flower is 90% water and a drying out of the plant can cause small blooms as well as bud drop. Camellias will use large quantities of water during the summer growing periods. For container-grown camellias, you will generally need to fill your containers once a week in the summer, and in the winter you should be able to stretch the period to approximately ten days. On very dry days, or when the temperature rises above 85°, sprinkle the foliage and the mulch in the late afternoon.

FERTILIZING—Fertilizing or feeding should start with the first signs of growth, even though the plant is still blooming. Plants should be fed only as needed, and caution taken never to over-feed. Camellias that have been injured with over-fertilizing take several seasons of special care to recuperate. Cottonseed meal or commercial food specifically for camellias should be used. Your local nurseryman or garden shop will carry the prepared mixture best suited to your own local conditions. Follow the directions as printed on the package. If the plant is dry, water well the day before feeding — never feed a dry plant. Feed every 6 to 8 weeks from April through September.

PESTS AND DISEASE—Other than feeding and watering, camellias require very little care. Some insect and pest control is necessary to insure a healthy plant. Scale and mites are the most serious threat as they extract the plant juices and interfere with the normal development of foliage and stem growth. Generally speaking, camellias rarely need spraying, so consult your local nurseryman and make certain that spraying is necessary.

PROTECTION—*C. Japonica*, *C. Reticulata* and the hybrids need protection from hot mid-day sun. For the flower's sake, the whites and pale pinks will need more shade than the deeper colors. Shade is a very relative term; in climates where humidity is high, camellias can stand more sun than in climates that are hot and dry. *C. Sasanqua* is able to stand full sun even in hot dry climates, but does equally well in light shade. As to protection from cold, *C. Sasanqua* will stand temperatures of 10 degrees above zero to 5 degrees below zero with no injury. The *japonicas* will stand temperatures to 5 degrees above zero, but the complete double flower types will have buds frozen and destroyed at this temperature. *C. Reticulata* is recommended for very mild areas or glass house culture only. The hybrids, because they are hybrids, will vary from variety to variety as to the cold each will stand. Some of them have gone through temperatures of zero with little ill effects.

Due to the ever increasing costs of freight, we are offering scions to those interested in propagating their own camellias. Because our primary business is growing and selling plants, scions will be sold only if readily available; we cannot, therefore, offer scions of varieties of which our saleable stock is limited. While we do not guarantee that our scions will live and grow, we do guarantee that they will be cut from healthy, vigorous plants, correctly labeled, and properly packed for prompt shipping, thereby giving you the best possible opportunity for maximum propagation success. Although we only guarantee that each scion will have but one growth bud, most of our scions will usually have two or three graftable buds.

On domestic scion orders add \$3.00 or 10¢ per scion, whichever is greater, for handling and postage; on foreign orders add \$7.50 or 25¢ per scion, whichever is greater. (NOTE: On all foreign orders please add \$6.00 for the required Department of Agriculture inspection fee). Please be sure to include your remittance with your order.

Those wishing to pick up scions at the nursery must place and pay for order a minimum of one week in advance of pick-up date.

The best scion wood is available from November through February, and we recommend that you place your scion order at this time. (Due to the excessive mail during Christmas, we do not recommend shipment during December).

AZALEAS IN THE LANDSCAPE

No other flowering shrub has contributed more to the gardens of America than the azalea when one considers that by proper selection of varieties, color in the garden can be had from October through June. Azaleas can be handled as pot plants, mass plantings, specimens, tree types, espalier and hedges. The versatility of this plant is unlimited. However, most azaleas are at their best when planted in groups or drifts. An ideal situation for them would be among high trees so spaced as to allow the sun and light to penetrate, yet providing intervals of shade to give the plants some respite from the hot sun. Where there are no trees, the north or east side of the house or high fence would be desirable. It is true that many azaleas thrive in full sun, especially along the coastal areas, but the Southern Indians are best suited for full sun plantings.

CULTURE - SOIL — Azaleas may be grown successfully in various acid soil mixtures, such as leaf mold (redwood, pine and oak), sand and light loam, but for best results, pure peat moss or $\frac{1}{2}$ peat and $\frac{1}{2}$ soil plantings have proven best. The hole need not be over 15" deep and 18 to 24" in diameter. Do not set the plant lower or higher than it was originally growing. Always soak peat moss thoroughly before using. Fill around ball of plant firmly and make certain that good drainage is maintained.

WATERING — Azaleas, much like camellias, should be moist at all times, but caution should be taken against their being WET at all times. Water well and deeply, but only as often as your own weather conditions demand. In areas such as Southern California where summer months are dry and arid, one may generally expect to water once a week. Spraying of the foliage in the late afternoon of hot days is very beneficial.

FERTILIZING — Azaleas are basically light feeders and caution should be taken never to overfeed. Three to four feedings spaced from March through September (6 to 8 weeks) are sufficient. Cottonseed meal or a commercial camellia-azalea food should be used. In Southern California use a tablespoon for each feeding of a plant which is about one foot high and one foot across. The labels on your fertilizer will generally advise you to cut the amounts in half for plants in containers. Never fertilize an azalea when leaves show a yellow or paleness between the veins. This is usually caused by lack of available iron and will most often respond to application of one of the many new chelated irons. Continue the use of iron instead of fertilizer until foliage becomes green. The annual use of NUCCIO'S Stabilized Iron is recommended.

PRUNING — Heavy pruning of undesirable branches should be done when they are at their peak of bloom and used as cut flowers. Most varieties of azaleas require one good pinching or pruning of new spring growth in July, thus creating more branches and bushiness for fall bud setting. However, when plants are young and vigorous, such as the Southern Indicas, pruning on new growth should continue through September.

PEST CONTROL — Azaleas are comparatively free of insects and disease, but for good, healthy, pest-free plants, a precautionary spraying in late spring (after blooming) and fall of Malathion or Kelthane can eliminate the danger of thrips and mites.

They are late blooming (May-June), and they have very dense growth habits and are excellent evergreen, spreading shrubs. Along with this, the many flower forms and many color combinations on one plant (sports) make them the ideal Bonsai plants. However, we at Nuccio's Nurseries feel confident that the satsuki azalea will contribute greatly to our Gardens as landscape and potted plants for the same reasons they are so popular as Bonsais.

Their culture is basically the same as all evergreen azaleas such as Kurumes, Belgians and Southern Indicas, etc., and they are as hardy as most Kurumes (5°) depending on age of plants, 3 to 4 years, and suddenness of temperature change.

Because of their distinctiveness and beauty, we offer the following list of varieties, selected from hundreds. The following format is used in the descriptions:

I **Flower:-**

- A — **Color:** The word "variations" for the many sports or combinations of colors, and the word "center" for the base color when blooms are bordered deeper or toned.
- B — **Size:** Very small — 1½"; Small — 1½-2"; Medium — 2-2½"; Medium large — 2½-3"; Large — 3-4"; Very large — 4-5"
- C — **Form:** Single, semi-double and double with petals that are wavy, frilled, pointed, round, spider or narrow and spaced, tubular or bell shaped.

II **Growth Habit:-** Most satsuki varieties are considered semi-dwarf or compact, 3' or less in 12 to 15 years, and with dense, spreading growth (wider than tall), and good branching qualities without pruning. However, they do respond to pinching and pruning for desired forms.

Very slow — 12"; Slow — 1-1½'; Medium — 1½-2'; Fast (vigorous) — 2-3'

III **Blooming Season:-** Satsuki means fifth month, and, or course, most varieties are late blooming (May-June). In mild climates, such as California, many varieties will spot bloom in the fall and winter months. However, with all varieties pruned in mid-July, the following schedule and code is used:
E — early (March-April); M — mid-season (Mid April-May); L — late (Mid May-June); VL — very late (Mid June-July)

Numbering system for multi-colored Satsukis and guarantee limitation: Many of the Satsukis offered here characteristically produce several different colors of flowers on one plant. The most common pattern for such varieties is to produce three different colors: a white striped with the other two colors (which we call "#1"), a light color ("#2"), and a dark color ("#3").

While it is this erratic sporting quality that makes these varieties of Satsukis so beautiful and fascinating, it is this same quality that presents difficulties for propagators as well. We attempt to take our cuttings from stock that is the #1 version of a variety. However, because our cuttings are taken from new growth not yet bloomed, it is very possible to cut from a #2 or #3 branch. A cutting grown from a #2 branch will generally produce two colors, the light color (#2) and the dark color (#3), while a cutting taken from a #3 branch tends to produce only the dark color.

Our guarantee for Satsukis is the same as for our other Azaleas and Camellias, namely, that they will be well rooted, well grown, true to name, and properly packed for shipping. However, it should be noted that while we take great care to send you the #1 version of the variety you select, we cannot guarantee that you will not receive a #2 or #3 version instead. But even these too are beautiful, some #2 and #3 versions so outstanding, in fact, that we are planning in the near future to include them in our Satsuki list.

SHIHOO—White with lavender and purple rose speckles and stripes with occasional solid colors of lavender pink edged white. Large, single to irregular semi-double with wide round petals. Medium, spreading, bushy growth. EL.

SHIKO—(Sport of Shihoo) Light to deep lavender with occasional darker stripes. Large, single to irregular semi-double with wide, round petals. Medium, spreading, bushy growth. EL.

SHIKO-NO-KAGAMI—Light lavender center, tipped purple on ends of petals. Many tones of lavender to purple with occasional solid purple blooms. Medium, single, pointed petals. Slow, spreading growth. M.

SHIN KOTOBUKI—Light orchid pink with occasional stripes of deep pink. Medium, single, round petals. Slow to medium, low, bushy growth. M.

SHIN-KYO—Light salmon pink center toned deeper coral toward outer edges. Many variations with occasional solid white blooms. Medium, single blooms. Vigorous, upright, bushy growth. EM.

SHINNYO-NO-HIKARI—(Sport of Kusadama) Variegated white, speckled and striped light pink and rose red with occasional solid colors. Medium large, single with wide, round petals. Vigorous, spreading growth. L.

SHINNYO-NO-TSUKI—White center, bordered rose red with occasional solid color. Medium large, single with wide, round petals. Vigorous, spreading growth. L.

SHINSEN—Variegated, white with pink and brilliant orange red speckles and stripes. Solid pinks and orange reds with many variations. Medium large, single, slightly bell shaped blooms with round petals. Vigorous, upright growth. ML.

SHINSHO-NO-HANA—White with many variations of pale pink to deep coral red and white center to coral red edge. Single, medium large, wavy petals. Vigorous, upright growth. M-L.

SHIN-YOMO-NO-HARU—(Sport of Takasago) Orchid. Medium large, single with ruffled petals. Vigorous, upright growth. L.

SHIRA-FUJI—White with some speckles and stripes of purple. Occasional white center with purple border, also solid lavender pink and purple blooms. Small, irregular single with some petals curled. Very slow, bushy growth with unusual variegated foliage—green bordered creamy white. M.

SHIRAITO-NO-TAKI—White with occasional lavender stripe. Small single with very few ragged petals and most blooms with stamens only. Vigorous, bushy, upright growth. L.

SHIRYU-NO-HOMARE—Purple. Medium, single with pointed and narrow spider petals. Vigorous, upright growth. Unusual slender, twisted foliage (Rinpu). MVL.

SHISUI—Deep pink. Small, spider petaled blooms. Many with ragged 3-4 petals and many blooms without petals—stamens only. Medium, upright growth. ML.

SHUGETSU—(Sport of Aikoku) White center, bordered purple. Some solid colors. Medium large, single, round petals. Medium, upright growth. M.

SHUHO-NO-HIKARI—(Sport of Kozan-No-Hikari) Light salmon pink to white edge with deep coral red throat. Small, single, narrow, spaced, pointed petals. Slow, bushy growth. LVL.

SHUKO-NO-TSUKI—White center, bordered orange red. Small, single, round, spaced petals. Medium, compact, spreading growth. EM.

SHUKUFUKU—Salmon pink with many variations of salmon and coral markings with occasional solid colors. Large, single, wide, round petals. Vigorous, open, upright growth. M.

SOGON-NISHIKI—Variegated white, speckled and striped pink and rose red with many variations. Medium, single, tubular blooms. Medium, compact, spreading growth. L.

SUZU—White, speckled and striped orchid pink and rose red. Many variations with some solid rose red and orchid pink edged white. Medium large, single, wide, round petals. Medium, bushy growth. ML.

SUMMER SUN—Brilliant orange red. Medium, single, pointed petals. Medium, upright, bushy growth with dark, narrow foliage. ML.

SUMMER TIME—Rose pink. Medium, semi-double to double. Vigorous, bushy, upright growth. LVL.

TAIHEIKAN—Blush pink center with pale to darker pink on edges. Single, medium. Medium growth. M.

TAIHO—Light salmon pink with stripes of coral red. Occasional white center with coral red border. Medium large, single, round petals. Medium, upright, bushy growth. LVL.

TAKARA—White with occasional coral rose stripes. Some blooms solid pink striped coral rose and solid coral rose. Medium large, single, wide, wavy, round petals. Medium, upright, bushy growth. L.

TAKASAGO—Orchid. Medium large, single with wide, wavy petals. Vigorous, upright growth. L.

TAMA-NO-HADA—White with coral stripes and occasional solid pink and coral blooms. Very large single, wide, round petals. Vigorous, open growth. ML.

TAMA-NO-HADA #2—(Outstanding sport of Tama-no-Hada) Pink edged white with light red spots in throat. Occasional solid coral blooms. Very large single, wide, round petals. Vigorous open growth. ML.

TAMA-NO-HIKARI—Light salmon pink with deeper salmon stripes. Occasional solid colors. Small, single with narrow, spaced petals. Slow, spreading, open growth. L.

TENSHO-NO-HIKARI—Variegated, white heavily speckled and striped coral pink to orange red. Some solid colors and some white center with orange red border. Many variations. Medium large, single with wide, round petals. Medium, upright, bushy growth. L.

TERUHIME—Light salmon pink deepening toward outer edges with occasional orange red blooms. Small single with narrow, pointed, spaced petals. Medium, spreading growth. M.

‡TOMEI-NISHIKI—Variegated, white to blush pink, speckled deeper pink with occasional coral rose stripes. Some solid colors. Small, single, round petals. Slow, open, spreading growth. ML.

TSUKI—White with occasional pale orchid pink to deep orchid rose stripes. Many variations with some solid colors. Medium large, single, with some blooms having 6 petals. M.

TSUKI-NO-HITOMARU—Light pink with occasional white stripes. Some blooms white tipped pink and some bordered pink. Medium, single, slightly spaced petals. Vigorous, upright, bushy growth. ML.

TSUKI-NO-SHIMO—Light pink. Medium single, wavy petals. Medium, compact growth with narrow leaves curved inward. (Rinpu type). M.

TSUYU-NO-HIKARI—White to light salmon pink heavily speckled and striped deep coral. Many variations with some solid colors. Small, single, spaced, pointed petals. Slow, upright, bushy growth. LVL.

‡UCHU-NO-TSUKI—White, speckled and striped coral and orange red. Occasional solid colors with white center bordered orange red. Medium, single, wide, round petals. Slow, bushy growth. ML.

UKIGUMA-NO-TSUKI—White to light pink to orange red mottled white with many variations. Medium large, single, wide, round petals. Slow to medium, bushy growth. ML.

UNGETSU-NO-HIKARI—Salmon pink, edged white. Heavily spotted throat with coral red. Small, single, spaced, pointed petals. Slow, bushy growth. ML.

UNRYU—Pale lavender to white center with deeper lavender edges. Medium, single, bell shaped blooms. Medium, very compact growth with narrow, twisted foliage (Rinpu). L.

‡UTAMARU—Blush pink with deeper pink throat. Small, single, round petals. Very slow spreading growth. L.

VALO—Orchid. Medium, single, star type petals. Medium, compact growth. L.

YAMAKAWA-NO-TSUKI—White to pink with white edges and occasional orange red stripes. Some blossoms with white center, bordered orange red. Large, single with some blooms having 6 petals. Vigorous, spreading growth. L.

YAMA-NO-HIKARI—White to deep coral pink with many variations of stripes and solid colors. Medium large, single with round petals. Vigorous, upright growth. M.

YAMATO-NO-HIKARI—White, speckled and striped with rose purple. Some solid colors. Large, single, slightly wavy petals. Slow, upright, bushy growth. LVL.

YATA-NO-KAGAMI—Blush pink center shaded deep coral to outer edges. Some blooms tipped coral and solid color. Medium, single, spaced petals. Medium, upright growth. EM.

YATA-NO-SAI—(Sport of Yata-no-Kagami) Blush pink center shaded deep coral to outer edges. Small, single, very narrow, spaced, pointed petals. Occasional blooms of Yata-no-Kagami. Medium, upright, growth. EM.

YAYOI-NO-TSUKI—White to pale pink with many variations of stripes and deep pink solids. Some with white star center and wide, dark pink margins. Single, medium large, wide round petals. Medium growth. M-L.

YODO-NO-HIKARI—White to light orchid pink, striped rose purple with some blooms tipped rose purple. Small, single, narrow, spaced, pointed petals. Medium, spreading growth. M.

YUGETSU—(Sport of Aikoku) White center, bordered deep lavender with some blooms bordered and striped deep lavender. Many variations. Medium large, single, round petals. Medium, upright growth. M.

YUKI-NO-MYOJO—Creamy white with lavender and purple flecks. Small, single, pointed petals. Slow, bushy growth. L.

YUME—Variegated white with many variations of salmon pink and orange red with many solid colors. Medium, single, round petals. Vigorous, open, spreading, cascading growth. L.

GARDENIAS

All our gardenias are grown in #1 containers (approx. 6" x 7"). They will generally range in height from 5" to 12", depending on variety.

MYSTERY—The old-fashioned favorite. Large double white blossom, 3"-4". Large, glossy, citrus-like foliage. Grows 3' to 4' high. Very sun tolerant. Very fragrant. \$3.50.

RADICANS—Dwarf gardenia. Miniature fragrant white double flower, approximately 1½". Variegated yellow and green foliage. \$4.00.

4-SEASONS (Kimura Shikizaki)—Outstanding Japanese variety. Compact grower with elongated leaves. Narrow-petaled, star-like double white fragrant blossom, 2½"-3". Very long blooming season. \$5.00.
