

PLEASE READ BEFORE ORDERING

ALL OF OUR CAMELLIAS AND AZALEAS are container grown. They will be shipped either in their containers, or will be balled and wrapped in waterproof material.

Notice to residents of the states of Alabama, Arizona, Arkansas, Florida, Louisiana, North Carolina, Oregon, South Carolina, Tennessee, Texas. Plants shipped to your state must be inspected and certified by the Los Angeles County Dept. of Agriculture. The Fee for this service is \$29.55 and must be added to your order.

Sorry, we presently can't ship to Mississippi.

Foreign orders: please inquire as regulations & restrictions vary by the country.

WE HAVE SUCCESSFULLY shipped Camellias all months of the year, but for best results we advise shipment from mid-October through March. Due to the holiday overload on shipping lines, we do not ship from Dec. 1 through Jan. 1.

ALL AZALEAS offered in this catalog are grown in No. #1 containers (approx. 6" x 7") (some slow growing and dwarf varieties may be in pots approx. 3" x 4") and will be shipped in same, or balled and wrapped. Azaleas can be shipped safely throughout the year.

NOTICE TO RESIDENTS OF COLD WEATHER AREAS:

We cannot guarantee against weather damage of our plants in transit. Transportation companies, likewise, will not insure against such damage. We advise, therefore, placing your order either early (Sept.-Oct.) or late (April), or as your weather dictates.

CAMELLIA CULTURE

SOIL: Basically, all Camellias require the same culture. They prefer a well-drained soil that is high in humus content and slightly acid. In preparing the soil for planting in the ground, mix equal portions of sandy loam and peat moss, by volume. If leaf mold is available, it may be used in place of peat moss.

PLANTING: Dig the planting hole twice as large as the root ball and one and one-half times as deep. Fill the bottom of the hole with the prepared soil and tamp down firmly so that the top of the root ball, when placed in the hole, is 1" ABOVE the soil surface, as there will be some settling. The only way Camellias are temperamental is in the depth of the planting. The air requirement of the root is high, and when planted too deep, the roots will smother. The root crown should never be more than 2" below the surface of the soil. Fill in around the sides of the root ball with this same mixture, tamping it down firmly with the feet as you fill, then mound soil 3" high in the form of a saucer on the outside rim of the planting hole. Fill this saucer with water.

WATERING: Camellias should be moist at all times, but caution should be taken against their being WET at all times. Water well and deeply, but only as often as your own local weather conditions demand. Too much water, too often, will cut off the air the roots must have. During the flowering period, watering should be watched, as the mature flower is 90% water and a drying out of the plant can cause undersized blooms, as well as bud drop. Camellias will use large quantities of water during the summer growing periods. For container-grown Camellias, you will generally need to fill your containers once a week in the summer, and in the winter, you should be able to stretch the period to approximately ten days. On very dry days, or when the temperature rises above 85, sprinkle the foliage and the mulch in the late afternoon.

FERTILIZING: Fertilizing, or feeding, should start with the first signs of growth, even though the plant is still blooming. Caution should be taken never to overfeed. Camellias that have been injured with over-fertilizing take several seasons of special care to recuperate. Cottonseed meal, or commercial food specifically for Camellias, should be used. Your local nurseryman or garden shop will carry the prepared mixture best suited to your own local conditions. Follow the directions as printed on the package. If the plant is dry, water well the day before feeding; never feed a dry plant. Feed every 6 or 8 weeks from April through September.

PESTS AND DISEASE: Other than feeding and watering, Camellias require very little care. Some insect and pest control is necessary to insure a healthy plant. Scale and mites are the most serious threat, as they extract the plant juices and interfere with the normal development of foliage and stem growth. Generally speaking, Camellias rarely need spraying, so consult your local nurseryman and make certain that spraying is necessary.

PROTECTION: *C. Japonica*, *C. Reticulata* and the hybrids need protection from hot midday sun. For the flower's sake, the whites and pale pinks will need more shade than the deeper colors. "Shade" is a very relative term; in climates where humidity is high, Camellias can stand more sun than in climates that are hot and dry. *C. Sasanqua* is able to stand full sun even in hot dry climates, but does equally well in light shade. As to protection from cold, *C. Sasanqua* will stand temperatures of 10 degrees above zero to 5 degrees below zero with no injury. The *Japonicas* will stand temperatures to 5 degrees above zero, but the complete double flower types will have buds frozen and destroyed at this temperature. *C. Reticulata* is recommended for very mild areas, or glass house culture only. The hybrids, because they are hybrids, will vary from variety to variety as to the cold each will stand. Some of them have gone through temperatures of zero with little ill effects.

Blooming season of all Camellias listed is denoted by E, M, L.

E: Early (Mid-September-November)

M: Midseason (December-February)

L: Late (March-April)

HYBRID CAMELLIAS

Hybrid Camellias are those having two or more species (usually Japonica mixed with other species) in their parentage. Both flower and growth habit will vary greatly depending upon species involved. To help identify the various parentages the following code is used:

R—Reticulata Hybrid. These usually produce large to very large blossoms on vigorous, open growing plants.

S—Saluenensis Hybrid. Although these vary greatly in growth habit, ranging from very compact to open and leggy, Saluenensis hybrids characteristically are small-leaved, Sasanqua-like plants that produce small to medium flowers, are very profuse, and tend to set buds even when young. Many are reputed to be cold hardy.

SP—These are actually Pitardii hybrids, but their overall appearance and performance are that of Saluenensis hybrids.

AZALEAS IN THE LANDSCAPE

No other flowering shrub has contributed more to the gardens of America than the Azalea, especially when one considers that by proper selection of varieties, color in the garden can be had from October through June. Azaleas can be handled as pot plants, mass planting, specimens, tree types, espalier and hedges. The versatility of this plant is unlimited. However, most Azaleas are at their best when planted in groups or drifts. An ideal situation for them would be among high trees, so spaced, as to allow the sun and light to penetrate, yet providing intervals of shade to give the plants some respite from the hot sun. Where there are no trees, the north or east side of the house, or high fence, would be desirable. Although it is true that many Azaleas thrive in full sun, especially along the coastal areas, the Southern Indians are best suited for full sun planting.

CULTURE-SOIL —Azaleas may be grown successfully in various acid soil mixtures, such as leaf mold (redwood, pine and oak), sand and light loam, but for best results, pure peat moss or 2/3 peat and 1/3 soil planting have proven best. The hole need not be over 15" deep and 18 to 24" in diameter. Do not set the plant lower or higher than it was originally growing. Always soak peat moss thoroughly before using. Fill around ball of plant firmly, and make certain that good drainage is maintained.

WATERING —Azaleas, much like Camellias, should be moist at all times, but caution should be taken against their being WET at all times. Water well and deeply, but only as often as your own weather conditions demand. In areas such as Southern California, where summer months are dry and arid, one may generally expect to water once a week. Spraying of the foliage in the late afternoon of hot days is very beneficial.

FERTILIZING —Azaleas are basically light feeders and caution should be taken never to overfeed. Three to four feedings spaced from March through September (6 to 8 weeks) are sufficient. Cottonseed meal, or a commercial Camellia-Azalea food, should be used. In Southern California, use a tablespoon for each feeding of a plant which is about one foot high and one foot across. The labels on your fertilizer will generally advise you to cut the amounts in half for plants in containers. Never fertilize an Azalea when leaves show a yellow or paleness between the veins. This is usually caused by lack of available iron, and will, most often, respond to application of one of the many new chelated irons. Continue the use of iron, instead of fertilizer, until foliage becomes green.

PRUNING —Heavy pruning of undesirable branches should be done when they are at their peak of bloom and used as cut flowers. Most varieties of Azaleas require one good pinching or pruning of new spring growth in June or July, thus creating more branches and bushiness for fall bud setting. However, when plants are young and vigorous, such as the Southern Indicas, pruning on new growth should continue through September.

PEST CONTROL —While Azaleas are comparatively free of insects and disease, the most commonly encountered pests are aphids and mites, mites being the more serious. Consult your local nurseryman for the sprays best suited for your area and spray only as needed.

HARU-NO-HIBIKI —An outstanding new Belgian type Azalea from Japan. Medium, semi-double, light pink to white center with pinkish red border. Very long blooming season. Medium compact growth. Dark green foliage.

HARU-NO-HIBIKI PINK—Blush orchid pink sport of Haru-No-Hibiki. Same excellent growth habit, foliage, and long blooming season as parent.

Koromo Shikibu is a single lavender with narrow, completely separated and well-spaced petals. The offspring have carried this trait and have given us a number of very unusual, cluster blooming, spider chrysanthemum-like Azaleas, making these truly unique and eye-catching. It was our first introduction in 1999, Nuccio's Purple Dragon, that has inspired us to call these the "Dragon Azaleas".

NUCCIO'S BEWITCHED —Large single. Soft orchid pink toned lighter. Nice, full broad petals tapering to a very narrow base. Strong, medium grower.

NUCCIO'S DRAGONFLY —Large single lavender. Long, narrow, spidery petals. Strong, medium grower. Long bloom.

Satsuki Azaleas are truly the treasures of Japan. For several centuries the Japanese gardener has enjoyed the luxury of the Satsuki Azaleas because of their adaptability to bonsai culture. They are late blooming (May-June), and they have very dense growth habits and are excellent evergreen, spreading shrubs. Along with this, the many flower forms and many color combinations on one plant (sports) make them the ideal bonsai plants. However, we at Nuccio's Nurseries feel confident that the Satsuki Azalea will contribute greatly to our gardens as landscape and potted plants for the same reasons they are so popular as bonsais.

Their culture is basically the same as all evergreen azaleas such as Kurumes, Belgians and Southern Indicas, etc., and they are as hardy as most Kurumes (5°) depending on age of plants, 3 to 4 years, and suddenness of temperature change.

Because of their distinctiveness and beauty, we offer the following list of varieties, selected from hundreds. The following format is used in the descriptions:

1. Flower:

A—Color: The word "variations" for the many sports or combinations of colors, and the word "center" for the base color when blooms are bordered deeper or toned.

B—Size: Very small— $1/2"$; Small $1\frac{1}{2}$ - $2"$; Medium— 2 - $2\frac{1}{2}"$; Medium large— $2\frac{1}{2}$ - $3"$; Large— 3 - $4"$; Very large— 4 - $5"$

C—Form: Single, semi-double and double with petals that are wavy, frilled, pointed, round, spider or narrow and spaced, tubular or bell shaped.

2. Growth Habit:

Most Satsuki varieties are considered semi-dwarf or compact, 3' or less in 12 to 15 years, and with dense, spreading growth (wider than tall), and good branching qualities without pruning. However, they do respond to pinching and pruning for desired forms.

Very slow— $12"$; Slow— $1\frac{1}{2}$ '; Medium— $1\frac{1}{2}$ - $2"$; Fast (vigorous)— 2 - $3'$

3. Blooming Season:

Satsuki means fifth month, and, of course, most varieties are late blooming (May-June). In mild climates, such as California, many varieties will spot bloom in the fall and winter months. However, with all varieties pruned in mid-July, the following schedule and code is used:

E—Early (March-April); **M—Mid-season** (Mid April-May); **L—Late** (Mid May-June);
VL—Very Late (Mid June-July)

Numbering system for multi-colored Satsukis and guarantee limitation: Many of the Satsukis offered here characteristically produce several different colors of flowers on one plant. The most common pattern for such varieties is to produce three different colors: a white striped with the other two colors (which we call "#1"), a light color ("#2"), and a dark color ("#3").

While it is this erratic sporting quality that makes these varieties of Satsuki so beautiful and fascinating, it is this same quality that presents difficulties for propagators as well. We attempt to take our cuttings from stock that is the #1 version of a variety. However, because our cuttings are taken from new growth not yet bloomed, it is very possible to cut from a #2 or #3 branch. A cutting grown from a #2 branch will generally produce two colors, the light color (#2) and the dark color (#3), while a cutting taken from a #3 branch tends to produce only the dark color.

Our guarantee for Satsukis is the same as for our other Azaleas and Camellias, namely, that they will be well rooted, well grown, true to name, and properly packed for shipping. However, it should be noted that while we take great care to send you the #1 version of the variety you select, we cannot guarantee that you will not receive a #2 or #3 version instead. But even these, too, are beautiful. Some #2 and #3 versions are so outstanding, in fact, that we are purposely propagating and including them in our Satsuki list.

AIKOKU —White with occasional stripe of purple and lavender pink. Some blooms solid lavender pink, edged white; some white center, bordered purple. Medium large, single, round petals. Medium, upright growth. M.

AI-NO-HIKARI —White to blush pink with blush pink tipped and bordered coral red. Medium large, single with slightly spaced petals. Medium to vigorous, spreading growth. M-L.

AZUMA-KAGAMI —Light pink shading to deeper pink edges with many variations of mottling and toning of blush to deep pink. Medium, single, round petals. Medium, spreading growth. E-M.

BENI-BOTAN —Salmon red. One of the few full double Satsukis. Medium large, round petals. Vigorous, upright, bushy growth. M.

BENI-GASA —Brilliant orange red. Large, single, round petals. Slow to medium spreading growth. E-M.

BUNKA —Soft salmon pink shading to deeper pink edges. Medium large, single, round petals. Slow to medium spreading growth. M.

CHIGO-SUGATA —White center with wide border of coral rose. Medium large, single with round overlapping wavy petals. Vigorous, spreading growth. M-L.

CHINZAN —Rose pink. Medium large, single, round petals. Medium to vigorous, very bushy, spreading growth. M-L.

CHITOSE-NISHIKI —Variegated, white with some stripes of light to rose pink. Many variations. Occasional solid colors. Small to medium, single, round petals. Slow to medium spreading growth. M.

CHIYO-NO-TSUKI —Variegated, white with some stripes of light salmon pink to deep coral red. Many variations. Small, single, pointed petals. Slow to medium, very compact growth. M-L.

The small flower is salmon with five very noticeable, very dark anthers. This is perhaps one of the easiest to grow of all the dwarfs; certainly, it is one of the best. L.

IKAZAN DWARF —(Growth sport of Kazan) This is a growth sport of Kazan and is even more dwarf than the original! The foliage is half the size of Kazan with an even slower rate of growth. Flower color and size are about the same as well as is the season of bloom.

KIKOSHI —Deep pink with white center. Occasional white and white tipped pink. Small, single, pointed petals. Medium, very bushy growth. M-L.

KIKUSUI —Variegated white with many pink stripes. Many variations of solid light and deep pink. Medium, single, round petals. Medium, compact growth. M.

KIMI-MARU —Light pink to deeper pink edges with occasional stripes of pink. Some variations. Single, medium, round petals. Slow to medium bushy growth. M.

KIMI-NO-HANA —White with occasional coral and orange red stripes. Many variations and solid colors of coral pink to orange red. Medium, single, round petals. Slow to medium, bushy, spreading growth. M-L.

KINPAI —Buff coral center with orange red border. Many blooms buff coral to buff coral tipped orange red. Medium large, single, round petals. Vigorous, spreading growth. E.

KINPO —White with creamy center. Medium, single, wavy, round petals. Slow to medium, compact growth. M-L.

* **KINSAI** —Coral red. Small single, spider petaled with some blooms round petaled. Medium, bushy growth. M.

KINPO-NISHIKI —Variegated, light salmon pink with salmon stripes. Occasional solid colors. Medium large, single, six or more round petals. Medium, compact, bushy growth. L-VL.

KOBAI —Rose red with occasional white blotches. Small, single with 5 to 7 round, overlapping petals. Slow, spreading, bushy growth. L.

* **KOGETSU** —White with bold stripes of pink and coral red. Many blooms with a white center washed pink and white center bordered coral red. Medium, single, wide, round petals. Medium to vigorous, open, spreading growth. M-L.

KOMEI —Variegated, white speckled and striped pink and rose pink. Many variations with occasional solid pink and rose pink blooms. Medium, single, spaced, round petals. Medium, bushy growth. M.

KONGO-NO-HIKARI —White, heavily speckled and striped pink and orange-red with many variations and solid colors. Medium, single, spaced petals. Vigorous, upright, bushy growth. M-L.

* **KORIN** —Rose Pink. Small, single, pointed petals. Medium with very compact growth. M.

KORYU —Light peach pink with occasional coral stripe. Small, single with narrow, spaced petals. Medium, spreading growth. M.

KORYU #2 —(Sport of Koryu) Small, single with narrow, spaced petals. Medium coral pink with occasional deep pink stripes and a white edge. Red spotted throat. Medium, spreading growth. M.

KOSIJI-NO-HIKARI —White with green throat, flecked and striped, deep rich purple with many variations. Single, medium large. Narrow petals. Medium, spreading growth. M.

* **KOZAN** —Pale salmon pink. Very small, single spaced, round petals. Very slow, bushy growth. M-L.

* **KOZAN-NO-HIKARI** —(Sport of Kozan) Light peach pink star shaped flower. Small single. Slow, bushy growth. M-L.

* **KOZAN-NO-TSUKI** —(Sport of Kozan) Light salmon pink, speckled and striped coral pink. Many variations with occasional solid colors. Small, single, round petals. Slow, open, spreading, cascading growth. M-L.

KUNPU —Orchid. Medium, single, wavy petals. Medium, compact growth. L.

KUSUDAMA —(Sport of Shinnyo-No-Tsuki) Variegated light pink, speckled and striped rose pink with many variations. Occasional solid and white center bordered rose pink. Medium large, single with wide round petals. Vigorous, spreading growth. L.

LAVENDER LADY —Deep lavender. Medium, single, wavy petals. Medium, spreading, compact, cascading growth. L.

MANGETSU —(Satsuki-Kurume Hybrid) Small single with purple border, white center. Slow to medium, compact growth. Long bloom. E-L.

MANSAKU —(Sport of Honen) Salmon pink with occasional white and deeper pink stripes. Medium large, single with wavy, round petals. Medium, rounded growth. M-L.

MATSU-KAGAMI —Variegated, white with speckles and stripes of salmon pink to deep coral red with buff center. Many variations and many solid colors. Medium, single, round petals. Vigorous, upright, bushy growth. M.

MATSU-NO-HOMARE —White with markings and stripes of pink to coral rose. Many variations with occasional solid colors. Small, single, narrow, round tipped petals. Slow, very bushy, upright growth. L-VL.

MEICHO —Coral pink with occasional deeper pink markings. Large, single, slightly wavy, wide, round petals. Medium, open, spreading growth. M.

MEOTO-KAGAMI —White, heavily speckled and striped pink and red. Many variations with some blooms white centered, washed pink, bordered white. Medium, single, wide petals. Slow to medium, compact growth. M.

MINATO —White center toning to orchid border. Medium, single to semi-double with wide, wavy petals. Vigorous, open upright growth. M-L.

MIZUHO-NO-KAGAMI —White with pale pink and soft coral red markings and stripes. Occasional solid colors and coral red with white center. Medium large, single, 5 to 6 wide petals. Medium, open, spreading, cascading growth. E.

"MRS. J. WARD" —Large single. Salmon orange red. Medium, semi-cascading growth. E-M.

NACHI-NO-TSUKI —Variegated white, speckled and striped with reddish purple. Many variations with occasional solid colors. Small, single, bell shaped with spaced, pointed petals. Slow to medium, compact growth. M.

* **NIKKO** —(Sport of Kozan) Light salmon pink with occasional white stripes to blush pink. Occasional solid, deep coral rose. Small, single petals. Very slow, compact-growth. L.

NUCCIO'S SATSUKI AND SATSUKI HYBRIDS —(See page 35.)

OSAKAZUKI —Deep rose pink. Medium, single, round petals. Medium, very bushy growth. L.

OTOME-NO-MAI —(Miyama Kirishima x Satsuki) Small purple hose-in-hose. Very long blooming. In mild climates blooms throughout the year. Medium, low bushy growth. E-VL.

PETUNIA —Light orchid center to deep orchid rose border. Medium large, single, wide, round petals. Vigorous, open, upright growth. E-M.

PINK GUMPO —(Sport of Gumpo) Deep salmon pink. Medium, single, ruffled petals. Slow, compact growth. M-L.

POLO —Blood red border shading to white at center. A rare color for Satsukis. Some flowers solid blood red. Medium single. Medium compact growth. Outstanding! E-M.

SAKURA-KAGAMI —Light salmon pink center toned deeper coral toward outer edges. Many variations with occasional solid white blooms. Medium, single petals. Vigorous, upright, bushy growth. E-M

* **SECCHU-NO-MATSU** —White, small tubular single. Very slow. Densely compact Rinpu type (narrow leaves curled inward). VL.

* **SEIKA** —White to buff center with orange red tips and borders. Medium, single, wide, round petals. Slow, compact growth. L.

* **SEIKO-NO-HIKARI** —Peach pink. Small, single, slightly pointed petals. Slow, compact growth. M.

* **SHICHI-FUKUJIN** —White, heavily striped coral pink. Many variations. Medium, single, round petals. Vigorous, upright growth. M-L.

SHIHOO —White with lavender and purple speckles and stripes with occasional solid colors of lavender pink edged white and solid colors of purple. Large, single to irregular semi-double with wide round petals. Medium, spreading, bushy growth. E-L.

SHIKO —(Sport of Shihoo) Light to deep lavender with occasional darker stripes. Large, single to irregular semi-double with wide, round petals. Medium, spreading, bushy growth. E-L.

SHIKO-NO-KAGAMI —Light lavender center, tipped purple on ends of petals. Many tones of lavender to purple with occasional solid purple blooms. Medium, single, pointed petals. Medium, spreading growth. M.

SHIN-KOTOBUKI —Light orchid pink with occasional stripes of deep pink. Medium, single, round petals. Slow to medium, low, bushy growth. M.

SHINNYO-NO-HIKARI —(Sport of Kusadama) Variegated white, speckled and striped light pink and rose red with occasional solid colors. Medium large, single with wide, round petals. Attractive dark green foliage variegated with yellowish green flecks and streaks. Vigorous spreading growth. L.

SUZU —White, speckled and striped orchid pink, coral pink, rose red and salmon. Many variations with some solid rose red, salmon, orchid pink edged white, and coral pink edged white. Medium large, single, wide, round petals. Medium, bushy growth. M-L.

SUMMER SUN —Brilliant orange red. Medium, single, pointed petals. Medium, upright, bushy growth with dark, narrow foliage. M-L.

TAKASAGO —Orchid. Medium large, single with wide, wavy petals. Vigorous, upright growth. L.

TAMA-NO-HADA —White with coral stripes and occasional solid pink and coral blooms. Very large single, wide, round petals. Vigorous, open growth, E-L.

TAMA-NO-HADA #2 —(Outstanding sport of Tama-no-Hada) Pink edged white with light red spots in throat. Occasional solid coral blooms. Very large single, wide, round petals. Vigorous open growth. E-L.

YAMA-NO-HIKARI —White to deep coral pink with many variations of stripes and solid colors. Medium large, single with round petals. Vigorous, spreading growth. M.

YAMATO-NO-HIKARI —White, speckled and striped with rose purple. Some solid colors. Large, single, slightly wavy petals. Slow, upright, bushy growth. L-VL.

YATA-NO-KAGAMI —Blush pink center shaded deep coral to outer edges. Some blooms tipped coral and solid color. Medium, single, spaced petals. Medium, spreading growth. E-M.

YATA-NO-SAI —(Sport of Yata-no-Kagami) Blush pink center shaded deep coral to outer edges. Small, single, very narrow, spaced, pointed petals. Occasional blooms of Yata-no-Kagami. Medium, spreading growth. E-M.

YAYOI-NO-TSUKI —White to pale orchid pink with many variations of stripes and deep orchid pink solids. Some with white star center and wide, dark pink margins. Single, medium large, wide round petals. Medium growth. M-L.


