THE COVER FLOWER

The gremlins that work on camellia plants to produce sports were at their best when they brought forth 'Sunset Oaks', a sport of 'Finlandia'. It had a little public showing late in the 1965-1966 season but most camellia people will not have an opportunity to see it until it blooms in the season that is just starting. The flower is a pale pink semi-double with deeper pink margin, 4 to $4\frac{1}{2}$ inches in diameter, that blooms early to mid-season. Kramer Bros. Nurseries of Upland, California are introducing it. Plants are also available at Nuccio's Nurseries, Altadena, California.
