Terrell Weaver is a *C. reticulata* hybrid being a cross of ‘Crimson Robe’ x ‘Villa De Nantes’. It was originated by Dr. Walter F. Homeyer Jr. of Macon, Georgia and was propagated and released by Nuccio’s Nurseries in 1975. The flower is a semi-double with ruffled, dark red petals.
