## THE COVER FLOWER

'MOUTANCHA' is a Yunnan reticulata, the first cultivars of which, came from China to the U.S.A. in 1948 under the auspices of Ralph Peer and the Descanso Gardens. (The name "Moutancha" means, Peony Flower.) The bloom is a large formal double with bright pink wavy, crinkled, crepe-like petals. The petals are veined and striped a silvery white on the inner part of the bloom. The plant has a medium growth and it blooms in the late season.
